Sandra Carol Lopez born in Auburn New York on Dec. 11, 1938, passed away after a short illness on Aug. 17, 2024. She was surrounded by her loved ones in her treasured home state of Arizona.

Sandra Carol Lopez (Jones) came to Arizona direct from the family farm in upstate New York when she was 10 years old with her parents, Estella (Jane) and Leslie Jones, and her younger sister and brother, Linda (Lynn) and Dave. The family settled in the Chandler and Mesa area where she eventually graduated from Mesa High School in May of 1956.

After high school, Sandra attended Northern Arizona University (NAU) in the fall of 1957 and lived in North Hall. She met the love of her life, her beloved and devoted husband of 66 years, Hector Lopez from Superior, AZ in the fall of 1957 at the student gathering place called the ASC Student Union (now the 1899 Bar and Grill) and they were married at the Guadalupe Catholic Church in Flagstaff in 1958. One of Sandra's most notable traits was her heartfelt, distinct and exuberant laugh that brought people together and warmed hearts. When Sandra laughed, which was often, she lit up a room and brought joy all around her.

In 1999, Sandra and Hector moved back to Mesa, Arizona from California and enjoyed the last 25 years being surrounded by close family especially in Sandra's favorite place, Pinetop Arizona. She and Hector built a large house to entertain friends, family, former students and colleagues. Many new memories and traditions were started and new friends were made over the years that enriched Sandra's life and gave her the delight in living in her beloved White Mountains. She even started a second career as a Special Education teacher at McNary Elementary School in White River for 4.5 years where she enjoyed teaching in the classroom to Apache reservation students and where once again, she made a difference in young people's lives.

Sandra was a kind and loving person, the best wife and mother ever! Truly unforgettable and full of light and love. She made this world a better place and she will be missed dearly by her husband Hector Lopez; daughters, Judi Lopez and Cyndy Lopez Bracero; her son-in-law, Ben Bracero; her cherished grandsons, Cameron Lopez, Aaron Lopez (June Lopez) and David Lopez (Rosario Garcia); and her special great-granddaughter, Clea Lopez, plus her many nieces and nephews. She is preceded in death by her beloved sons, Gary K. Lopez and Lawrence B. Lopez; her parents; and her sister and brother.

Arizona Forestry earmarks \$2 million to support communities with wildfire risk reduction projects; Oracle, Superior to receive funds

As part of the Arizona Department of Forestry and Fire Management's

(DFFM) Healthy Forest Initiative (HFI), the agency earmarks \$2 million for 10

fuels management projects that support wildfire risk reduction efforts.

The 10 projects equate to 3,000 acres of project work throughout the state. Some of those projects earmarked for the funding include, \$100,000 to support the Peeples Valley Fire District with their Model Creek Phase 6 project. This 53-acre project located southwest of Peeples Valley plans to improve the existing fire control features and serve as an evacuation route for the community. The project includes hand thinning and mastication work to reduce vegetation by 60%.

Another project earmarked for HFI funding includes \$90,000 for a 35-acre project as part of the Oracle Fire District's ongoing community fuels reduction efforts. Oracle's project aims to enhance the firebreak between the Coronado National Forest and the community.

Additional funding earmarked for projects include:

- Timber Mesa Fire and Medical District

- \$200,000

- Pine-Strawberry Fire District – \$468,000

- Ponderosa Fire District – \$125,000

- Prescott Area Wildland Urban Interface (PAWUIC) - \$156,000

- Town of Superior – \$146,000

- Fry Fire District – \$154,000

- Peeples Valley Fire Department Auxiliary – \$100,000

- Salt River Project Agriculture Improvement Power District – \$500,000

The HFI program focuses on fire prevention, critical infrastructure protection, and forest and watershed restoration through reduction of hazardous vegetation. HFI grants are supported through state and federal funding. These grants are one of many DFFM offers to support fuels reduction work, invasive plants and pests treatments, urban and community forestry efforts, and fire district/department equipment and training support.

Superior renews Emergency Air Medical Membership Agreement with PHI Cares

The Town Council of the Town of Superior and Town Manager, Todd Pryor, have approved the air medical agreement with PHI Cares, a division of PHI Air Medical, a leading U.S. helicopter-based medical transport provider. In emergencies, residents should contact 911. Following a flight, the resident flown or representative on their behalf should notify PHI Cares at 1.888.I.Fly.PHI (1.888.435.9744) and supply the County membership number #038646 and any transport details available.

The local agreement was spearheaded by Carrie Brookshire, who said: "The people of the Town of Superior are a main priority, and the agreement between the Town of Superior and PHI Cares protects residents by offering vital, life-saving services in times of emergency. By renewing this agreement, the residents of the Town of Superior and their household have peace of mind that they are protected in a serious emergency. We urge all residents to pick up their membership cards and seriously think about protecting the rest of their household and themselves when traveling out of county."

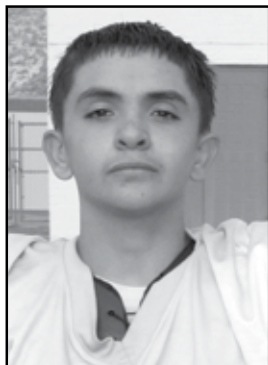

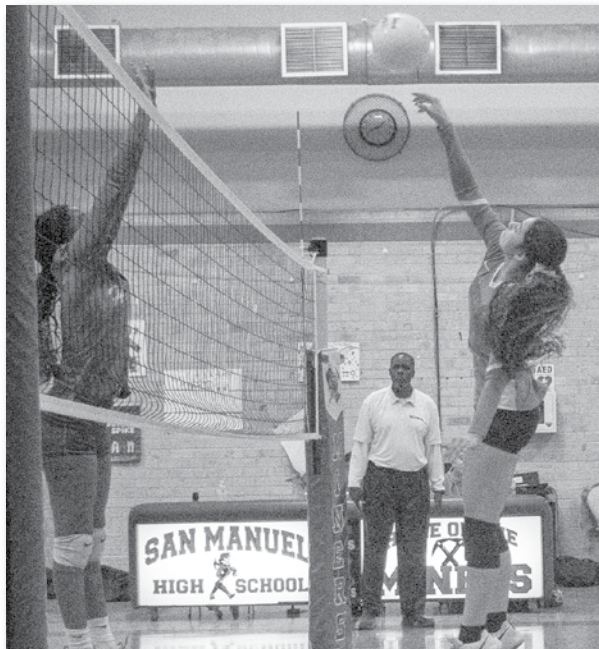
Three Copper Corridor volleyball teams faced off

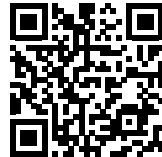
