Education Forward Arizona, Freeport McMoRan continue scholarship program; priority application deadline is Jan. 31

Education Forward Arizona and Freeport-McMoRan are proud to announce the continuation of the successful Guarantee Your Future with Freeport program, now entering its second year. This initiative is designed to engage ambitious individuals through an innovative scholarship and job placement program.

Building on last year's success, the Guarantee Your Future with Freeport program will support at least 25 students by providing education, training, a paid summer internship and job placement in one of six critical technical areas. Students will earn a certificate or credential from a designated community college in Arizona, Colorado or New Mexico.

Participants in this innovative workforce development program will begin classes in August 2025 to earn a certification in one of six areas vital to the mining industry:

- Diesel technician
- Industrial electrical
- Process control/instrumentation technology
- Fixed plant maintenance/advanced manufacturing
- Heavy equipment operations
- Welding

This scholarship covers education expenses (tuition, fees,

books, etc.) and assists with other costs of attendance (food, housing, transportation, etc.). Students must commit to work for the company for three years and upon fulfilling program and employment requirements, participants will be offered a full-time position at one of Freeport-McMoRan's Arizona, Colorado or New Mexico operations.

Participants must be 18 years or older at the time of employment with Freeport-McMoRan. The priority deadline to apply is Friday, Jan. 31, and final deadline is Feb. 15, 2025. To apply, visit <https://educationforwardarizona.org/futurewithfreeport/>.

as well as a mentor from Freeport-McMoRan. Training will continue during a paid summer internship where participants will gain real-world experience in the industry.

Lower San Pedro Watershed Alliance to meet Feb. 11

The Lower San Pedro Watershed Alliance (LSPWA) will host a public meeting Feb. 11 at the Mammoth Community Center from 6-7:30 p.m. to discuss its role in addressing past, current and future threats to the area, ranging from industrial-scale power lines and copper mining to the Air Force's overflight plans for supersonic fighter jets.

Attendees will learn from LSPWA's all-volunteer group of local residents about the organization's considerable efforts over the past 13 years to safeguard the Lower San Pedro River's water resources and its unique riparian bio-habitat. Partner groups, including Cascabel Conservation Association, Center for Biological Diversity, Save the Scenic Santa Ritas and Arizona Mining Reform Coalition, will share challenges and lessons learned in addressing similar industrial threats.

Participants will have the opportunity to learn more about Southern Arizona's last intact river ecosystem and watershed health, ask questions, meet LSPWA's active members and partners, and find out how to get involved.

About the San Pedro River

Beyond providing a home for numerous rare and endangered species, the San Pedro River offers a critical flyway for some one million migratory birds each year. Its unspoiled wilderness is a powerful draw for those who have made their homes here, as well as thousands of annual visitors.

WHEREAS, the Town Council has, at its regularly scheduled meeting held on January 09, 2025, studied and considered Ordinance No. 2025-194, an Ordinance approving the Variance request for reduction of front yard setback from 20 feet to 10 feet for single residence zone district R1-5 for Assessor's Parcel Number 105-04-027, also known as 270 W Terrace Drive, Superior, Arizona; and **WHEREAS**, the Town Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the Town to enact this Ordinance in order to enhance the quality of life and to protect the health, safety and welfare of its citizens; and

SECTION I: Amend the Variance request for reduction of front yard setback from 20 feet to 10 feet for single residence zone district R1-5 for Assessor's Parcel No. 105-04-027, also known as 270 W Terrace Drive, Superior, Arizona, as well as attached Exhibits to this Ordinance as though fully set forth herein.

Teens learn crime investigation skills

On Jan. 10, 2025, Jamie Wolgast and the Hayden Library, began a Forensic Science Class; Murder at Eagle Nest Harbor.

"I am always trying to find fun and different ways to teach new skills to the youth. I thought this might be something that would get them interested in different career opportunities," Jamie said. Jamie is well versed in creating exciting and engaging themes and adventures for children. She spent several years working as the Program Director for the College for Kids Program held at Central Arizona College.

This four-part class was surprisingly detail oriented. Students would start the first class with a mock crime scene, which was complete with fake blood from two sources, a "murder weapon," some unidentified fiber samples, and a note from the attacker. These investigators then learned how to label, gather, and catalog evidence. They would then obtain a copy of the mock police report, and start their own case study and scientific analysis, outlining suspects and timeline of events. They even wrote out a white board complete with the names of persons of interest, photos, and possible clues.

The second class, which was held Friday, Jan. 24, the investigators learned how to identify different types of fibers, both natural and synthetic. They learned what compositions and properties different types of fibers are classified by and what the different fibers including animal hair, fur, and silk looked like under a microscope, as well as various plant fibers. Mr. Deere, a Science teacher from Hayden-Winkelman School District, even provided glass slides and microscopes for students to use.

There is still time to get in the action! There are still two classes remaining. On Feb. 14, they will teach blood typing and analysis. Students will learn all about different
