US 60 reopened between Superior and Miami after extended closure following blasting

US 60 has reopened between Superior and Miami after an extended closure needed to safely remove unstable rock exposed Tuesday during blasting operations for a bridge replacement project. The speed limit has been reduced to 25 mph through the area at milepost 227. The road was closed until Friday.

Full closures for this project, which is replacing the Queen Creek Bridge and Waterfall Canyon Bridge east of Superior, are normally scheduled from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, as needed, for blasting and cleanup. During closures, drivers can detour through Winkelman on state routes 77 and 177. The next closure is Feb. 12 and 13.

Richard W. Ross, born in Middletown, Ohio on Aug. 28, 1933, was the only son of Heber and Evelyn Ross. He was 91 years old when God called him unto Himself, and

He also worked for Magma as a timekeeper and accountant, and was a bookkeeper for many businesses in San Manuel, Arizona.

Richard was a gifted musician. He played the clarinet at Tucson High School, University of Arizona, and in jazz bands. At a young age he also played piano for recitals and during offertories at Tucson's First Baptist Church.


Dad was raised by Christian parents, and as a boy he openly professed his faith in Jesus Christ. Throughout his life he served in music ministry, pulpit evangelism, and church administration. He led church choirs, directed congregational singing, and served on deacon and leadership boards for many churches throughout Oracle, San Manuel, Mammoth, Kearny, Tucson and Rancho Vistoso.

Dad's memorial service will be held in the chapel of Evergreen Mortuary at 1 p.m. on Feb. 27. Interment immediately follows with a private gathering.

2. The Court has set an Initial hearing on
the 25th day of February, 2025 at 10:00 a.m.,
and a Publication hearing on the 15th day of
April, 2025 at 9:00 a.m., at the Pinal County
Superior Court, 971 North Jason Lopez
Circle, Florence, Arizona 85132, before the
Honorable Lawrence M Wharton for the
purpose of determining whether any parent
or guardian named herein is contesting the
allegations in the Petition.

3. You and your children are entitled to have
an attorney present at the hearing. You
may hire your own attorney or, if you cannot
afford an attorney and want to be represented
by an attorney, one may be appointed by
the Court.

4. You have a right to appear as a party
in this proceeding. You are advised that
your failure to personally appear in court
at the initial hearing, pretrial conference,
status conference or dependency adjudication,
without good cause shown, may result
in a finding that you have waived your
legal rights and have admitted the
allegations in the Amended Petition. In
addition, if you fail to appear, without
good cause, the hearing may go forward
in your absence and may result in an
adjudication of dependency, termination
of your parental rights or the establishment
of a permanent guardianship based upon
the record and the evidence presented to
the court, as well as an order of
paternity, custody, or change of custody
in a consolidated family law matter and
an order for child support if paternity
has been established.

5. Notice is given that DCS is proposing
to substantiate any allegations of abuse
and/or neglect contained in the amended
dependency petition for placement in the
DCS Central Registry. The DCS Central
Registry is a confidential list of DCS
findings that tracks abuse and neglect. If
the court finds your children dependent
based upon allegations of abuse and/or
neglect contained in the amended
dependency petition, you will be placed
in the DCS Central Registry. See A.R.S. §
8-804.

Main Street Rehabilitation Project: Temporary partial closure to begin February 24

The Town of Superior is pleased to announce its planned Main Street rehabilitation project in the Winter-Spring of 2025. This multimodal transportation project includes removing three inches of the existing asphalt pavement and paving with new rubberized asphalt, new striping of the entire street, adding crosswalk striping and additional parking lot striping near Besich Park, and adding a sidewalk in front of the park.

Funding for this project was provided through the ADOT's HURF transfer program. Main Street is eligible for funding, as it is classified as a minor collector by ADOT. This minimum classification only covers Main Street and Sunset/Panther, and funding can't be used for any other local roads. The town has received significant funding for both of

these streets through the state.

Beginning Monday, Feb. 24, 2025, Main Street will be temporarily and intermittently closed. All work should be complete by mid-April 2025. Access may be possible with alternating lane closures and traffic controls. Traffic Control closure signs and barricades will be placed where the construction will occur.

Road work will begin soon on Main Street in Superior and will continue through mid-April.
