Light of Day, a two-person show by Robert Cao-Ba and Pama Peckham Cao-Ba, opens March 7, 4-6 p.m. at Oracle Center for the Arts, 700 E. Kingston St., Oracle, AZ 85623, and may be viewed March 30 2:30-5 p.m., April 27 2:30-5 p.m. and by appointment at 480-297-8881.

The southwest sunlight is the great unifier in Robert Cao-Ba's paintings, collecting natural elements into a luminous whole.

Born in the coastal city of Casablanca, Morocco, Cao-Ba, a graduate of the Art Institute of Boston, has embraced the desert and heritage of Arizona. Visits to rodeos, ranches and a particularly memorable round up in Wickenburg, give him subject matter and inspiration.

His new series highlights Oracle's grasslands, boulders and clouds.

"The light is always changing how I see," he said.

Arts, respectively.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Threats to the Lower San Pedro Valley (Watershed)

I read T. C. Brown's article about the Feb. 11 meeting hosted by the local group, Lower San Pedro Watershed Alliance (LSPWA). I was pleased that he mostly presented an unbiased account of the meeting and that he encouraged people to personally research the content presented at the meeting.

I was very disappointed that, in his closing comments, he choose to cite a Gov.tech Emergency Management Blog article about NIMBYs and BANANAS. Selecting this article is a disservice to the significant contribution of this organization to reality based Emergency Management. It's like picking one word from a book to

represent its overall message and purpose.

To those who don't know, NIMBY stands for "Not In My Backyard." BANANA, apparently is a new moniker for "Build Absolutely Nothing Anywhere Near Anyone." These are phrases most commonly used by narrow economic interests to characterize people opposed to them. In reality, these are people who are concerned about protecting and sustaining a healthy community, yet they are branded as "extremists."

I strive daily to make Oracle a safe, healthy and economically sustainable community. I am a member of several local groups to achieve those goals. I guess that makes me and those I collaborate with "extremists."

I empathize with my friends and residents in Mammoth and San Manuel who strive to make their communities safe, healthy and economically viable. I guess that also makes them "extremists."

It's easy for someone who is uninformed/misinformed or not facing the threats in their own backyard to toss NIMBY stones. If they faced the potential threats their neighbors do - dry wells, contaminated water, hazardous air quality, decreased property values and possibly unsellable property - they would be offended by being called NIMBY extremists.

We can do better than this. We can treat our neighbors with respect and strive to collectively find the truth.

While I support the need for extraction projects, there is a right place and wrong place for such projects. It is my belief that there is not, nor will there be enough water to support the mining activity and our communities as proposed by the Redhawk investors.

The Redhawk investors may be on legal grounds using

outdated water and mining laws to pursue their economic interests, but that does not morally or ethically justify their activities. They have made a grossly misguided investment based on an over optimistic assessment of their economic opportunity. Proposed economic benefits to a small group of people must be weighed against the impact on our communities and ecological resources.

According to Redhawk's own published reports, any claims about environmental impact and economic benefits are "speculative."

Wrapping and marketing the investment project in terms of patriotism, national security, extreme need for copper and economic benefits does not change the threat to the safety, health and economic viability of our communities.

Those in Mammoth and San Manuel who will live closest to toxic tailings and a water-guzzling hole in the ground will experience as in past years, air, water and light pollution. They'll hear a mine that's running 24/7 and experience the nonstop semi- traffic.

Let's have the courage to work together to protect our communities and save this unique place of extensive ecological resources. After all, it is our home ... where we should be safe and healthy!

BLM opens comment period on proposed mining exploration near Mammoth

SAFFORD, Ariz. – The Bureau of Land Management is seeking public input on a draft environmental assessment for the proposed Copper Creek Exploration Project on public lands near Mammoth in Pinal County.

If approved, Redhawk Copper, Inc., would be authorized to modify 18 acres of public lands, including six acres to construct 67 drill pad sites and 12 acres for associated access roads. The company would eventually return 14 of the modified acres to their original state. The remaining four acres would be for widening existing roads open to the public for recreation and other activities. Any future plans to mine as a result of this exploration would include further analysis and opportunities for additional public review and

comment.

Kelly, Gallego introduce bill to pave way for Gila County Veterans Center

Last week, Arizona Senators Mark Kelly and Ruben Gallego reintroduced legislation to transfer the Pleasant Valley Ranger District Administrative Site to Gila County, paving the way for the development of a veterans retreat and community center to support the nearly 5,500 military veterans who call the county home.

The bill directs the U.S. Forest Service to transfer 232.9 acres of underutilized National Forest land near Young, Arizona to Gila County. Once transferred, the site will be transformed into a dedicated space for veterans and their families to gather for retreats, meetings, and community events. The center will also serve as a mobile VA clinic site, expanding access to critical health care services for veterans in rural Arizona.

“For too long, this land has been sitting idle when it could be put to use supporting the veterans who made immense sacrifices for our country,” said Kelly. “By transferring this land to Gila County, we’re ensuring veterans, and their families have a space to gather, connect, and access health care closer to home.”

“Having a place to gather with fellow veterans, connect with nature, and access services is vital to veterans’ well-being,” said Gallego. “I’m proud to introduce this

legislation with Senator Kelly that will repurpose this land for the benefit of Gila County veterans.”

“I really appreciate Senator Kelly’s ongoing support of this important project for our Arizona veterans. The Pleasant Valley Veterans Retreat provides a beautiful and peaceful facility in rural Arizona not only for Gila County veterans, but for veterans across the state and other states as well. While providing for our veterans it also repurposes a former United States Forest Service administrative site,” said Gila County District 3 Supervisor Woody Cline.

Petitioner, YVONA MARIE CAMPBELL, by and through her attorney undersigned, in support of her Motion to Vacate Orders of April 26, 2018 and June 13, 2018, pursuant to Arizona Rules of Family Law Procedure ("ARFLP"), Rule 85(b)(6), states as follows: 1. On April 26, 2018 the parties were divorced. 2. Pursuant to the Decree of Dissolution ("Decree"), Respondent was awarded 22.701% of the Petitioner's Arizona State Retirement System ("ASRS") instead of 50% of the pension because of an offset. 3. The value of Petitioner's ASRS pension as of the date of November 10, 2017 was \$62,823.00. It is clear from the Decree that the Court intended that Respondent receive the percentage of the value of the benefits at the time of the Decree as the Decree states: THE COURT FINDS that the above allocation of the real and personal property, under the circumstances set forth above, Wife is entitled to an offset based upon the below analysis: Timeshare Offset: \$7450.00, Business Interest: 725.00 Motor Vehicles: 8,975.00 Total: \$17,150.00 Husband's share of ASRS plan: \$31,411.50 Amount Wife owes Husband after deduction of offset from Husband's ASRS plan share: \$14,261.50 This amount represents 22.701 % of the balance of Wife's ASRS retirement plan as of the date of service (\$62,823.00 x 22.701 % = \$14,261.45). Therefore, Husband should receive 22.701 % of the community share of Wife's ASRS retirement plan calculated on the basis of the coverture fraction formula, rather than 50% of the community share on the basis of the said formula. Emphasis added. 4. Based on this computation, Respondent's share of the pension would be approximately \$14,260.00. 5. Because of the language in the Decree, the form QDRO prepared by Petitioner without counsel inserted the percentage determined by the Court without specifying that the percentage was to be based on the value of the pension as of the date of service. Thus, the language is being interpreted to award Respondent 22.701% of the current value of the pension, that being approximately \$242,000. This QDRO was filed on June 13, 2018. 6. Petitioner did not realize the problem with the Decree of Dissolution and QDRO until just recently, when she retired and the ASRS was set to be divided. 7. Although the Court referenced the coverture fraction formula in its Decree, the QDRO issued did not structure Respondent's interest in Petitioner's plan in terms of the formula. Had it done so, Respondent's interest in the plan would have been a lower percentage of a higher amount of benefits, not a fixed percentage of a higher amount of benefits. Based on Petitioner's years of service while married (10) compared to her total years of service (16), Respondent's percentage share of Petitioner's current benefits would now be 14.19%. 17. Rule 85(b)(6) allows this Court to vacate a judgment for any reason justifying relief so long as the Motion to Set Aside is filed in a reasonable time. This Motion is being filed shortly after Petitioner was made aware of the error, which is clearly a reasonable period of time. Further, the circumstances of this case, as set forth above, justify relief from the Court's Orders regarding a division of Petitioner's pension. 8. Once the relevant provisions of the parties' Decree and the resulting June 13, 2018 Order is set aside, a new Order can be created that would accurately award Respondent his share of Petitioner's ASRS benefits based on the coverture fraction formula taking into account the lesser percentage he was originally awarded because of offsets. WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests that this Court vacate the relevant provisions of the parties' Decree and the QDRO filed June 13, 2018 so that a corrected Decree and QDRO can be prepared and approved by the Court. Frances Amparano – Senior Olympics Medalist

It takes a lot of dedication and discipline to be an athlete, and to carry that beyond your younger years takes even more of it. A perfect example is Frances Amparano, 1966 San Manuel Alumni and athlete. In high school, Frances was an all around athlete, competing in Track & Field, Basketball, Volleyball, Tennis and Badminton. Staying active after high school, Frances would make sure to go for runs or bike rides, even when she was working as at the copper mine in Kearny or at the fire department. She also was an aerobics instructor.

After raising her three daughters, and helping with her grandkids, Frances returned to college to finish her RN degree, taking classes at Pima Community College and U of A. While at PCC, Frances made it onto the college track team, building a fanbase of spectators who couldn't believe that she was 48 years old, competing so tenaciously against her younger opponents.

It was during a Track & Field meet that one of the officials informed her about the Senior Olympics, and that she would be eligible to compete in them when she turned 50. Once the time came, and Frances was 50, she began competing in the Arizona Senior Olympics. During her

first year she brought home 5 gold medals, 2 silver, and a bronze medal, collecting more and more throughout the years.

“That’s my life, keeping in shape and training,” Frances commented, “In 2019, I made regionals, and I was going to go compete in Florida. I was so excited, but then with COVID, everything closed down. So, I hadn’t done the Senior Olympics since 2019.”

After surviving a heart attack, Frances continued to train to compete in the Senior Olympics once cleared by her doctor. In January she competed in this year’s Arizona Senior Olympics in Tucson, her first year back since her heart attack. She brought home 10 medals. She won seven golds and one silver in track & field, competing in shot put, javelin, running long jump, standing long jump, high jump, 50m run, and 100m dash. She won two silvers in swimming, doing freestyle and butterfly stroke. She is getting ready, and training for state, with hopes to make it to regionals in Iowa.

Frances takes pride in her athletic accomplishments, but takes more pride in her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. Whether it’s inspiring them to follow in her athletic passion, or her dedication to education, she loves her family. Good luck at your next competition, Frances. You are an inspiring athlete!
