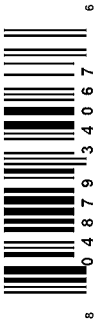

Tips to Prevent Summer Slide

Capable of programming in CASIO Basic and MicroPython and approved for the SAT, PSAT, ACT and AP tests, the fx-9750GIII will be their go-to calculator for years to come, making this summer a great time to get acquainted with its interface.

- Make conversation happen: Is your student taking a foreign language? Arrange for them to meet with a language partner so they can keep the conversation going throughout summer. Also, check out the wide variety of foreign language movies, music and other media available through streaming platforms, so your student can stay immersed in their language of choice, even when class is out of session.

With a few measures designed to stem the tide of summer slide, you can help ensure that when your student returns to the classroom, they are prepared for the next level of instruction, not playing catch-up.

Tina's hobbies included watching classic movies and musicals, listening and dancing to music, drawing, photography, and scrapbooking. She was a huge fan of the Arizona Diamondbacks and regularly attended baseball games with her husband.

As her dementia progressed, Tina moved to Catalina Springs Memory Care facility. Tina regularly greeted caregivers and staff with a big smile, hugs, and kisses. She enjoyed the Montessori button sorting and loved to talk about her family and had great stories to share.

Tina is survived by her husband, James (Bob) of 60 years. Her children are John (Debbie), Michele (Mark), and Jason (Krista). Grandmother of Aubree and Jordan Fox; Ian (Allison), Brynn (Triston), and Ryan Guillot; and Jacob Fox and Great Grandmother of Bryson, Kaison, and Kaedon.

She will be missed by her family, friends, and the community she impacted through her activities.

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Get involved for National Foster Care Month: Five ways you can make a difference for a child in foster care

National Foster Care Month in May invites us to acknowledge the essential roles we can each play in transforming the lives of foster youth within our communities. As of the end of February 2025, there were **7,711 children** residing in out-of-home foster care settings in Arizona (Department of Child Safety - Monthly Operations Report, <https://dcs.az.gov/reports>).

Thousands of dedicated foster parents, social workers, advocates, professionals, and volunteers are tirelessly working to protect and nurture these vulnerable children, striving to find them a permanent and stable place to call home. However, there is still much more that the community can do to assist.

“This May, we encourage every community member to consider getting involved,” stated Emily Nader, CASA Coordinator. “There are numerous ways to make a difference, such as becoming a child’s CASA. While a child may be surrounded by caring adults providing services to their family, a CASA serves as a consistent adult who advocates solely for the child’s safety and best interests. We play a crucial role in the child’s support team, helping them heal from past trauma and achieve a permanent and safe resolution to their case.”

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Speaking Out Against School Vouchers

Lawmakers at the state Capitol in Phoenix are working on a ballot initiative that would increase teacher pay while also constitutionally protecting the state’s school voucher program. The Superior Unified School District educates students in grades PreK-12. We do not receive funding for our preschool students, and we receive only ½ funding for our kindergarten students. The District also employs over 50 people. We are held accountable by the Department of Education, AZ Auditor General, and Federal Government for every dollar the district spends. Vouchers go to individual and private institutions that can discriminate in enrollment against students and their families. Vouchers largely benefit families living in the wealthiest zip codes in Maricopa County. Superior’s Governing Board members are good stewards of taxpayer dollars, so much so that our community has trusted us enough to pass the last several override and bond elections. Lawmakers consistently advocate for accountability for how public schools spend money, but don’t expect any accountability for how vouchers are spent. What has always been great about Superior is the relationship between our schools and our community. They are connected by our families. They are “Superior!” Our schools are mandated to teach the Arizona State Standards, administer state assessments, and ensure that we maintain our national accreditation, so our students are prepared for their future. Private schools can teach whatever

they want, aren’t required to test their students, and are not required to be nationally accredited. In the last five years, SUSD has raised its teacher salary by over 20%. We also haven’t cut any programs due to declining

enrollment and reduced funding. Despite this, SUSD still has needs. It is crucial that the legislature continue to invest in public school districts so that we can continue to raise teacher pay every year, pay our

bus drivers to provide transportation for our school programs, and provide high quality learning environments for every student. The Superior Unified School District mission is to educate every single

student in our community without regard to race, income, ability, religion, or gender. Many private schools that take voucher dollars cannot say the same. Superior families support Superior Schools and will see through this

proposal. I urge you to reach out to our legislators in District 7 and vote against any voucher initiative that is placed on the ballot. Sincerely, /s/ **Stephen Estatico**

Fire activity and dry conditions prompt Stage 2 fire restrictions in Southeastern Arizona

Due to severe and extreme drought conditions and an uptick in fire activity, Arizona State, federal agencies, and Tribal agencies representing southeast Arizona plan to implement Stage 2 fire restrictions. Effective Monday, May 12, 2025, the Arizona Department of Forestry and Fire Management, Bureau of Land Management Gila District, Coronado National Forest, Saguaro National Park, Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument, Casa Grande Ruins National Monument,

Coronado National Memorial, Chiricahua National Monument, Fort Bowie National Historic Site, Tumacácori National Historic Park, Buenos Aires National Wildlife Refuge, and Cabeza Prieta National Wildlife Refuge will implement campfire and smoking restrictions in southeastern Arizona. A burn moratorium also goes into effect Monday, May 12, on the Gila River Indian Community. The San Carlos Apache Tribe has been in Stage 2 restrictions since March.

Residents and visitors should check with the respective county and tribal governments for information on the implementation of fire bans across unincorporated county lands as well as within tribal jurisdictions. Beginning May 12, 2025, and until rescinded, the following are prohibited:

- Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, charcoal, coal, elevated grill, or wood stove. This includes fires in developed

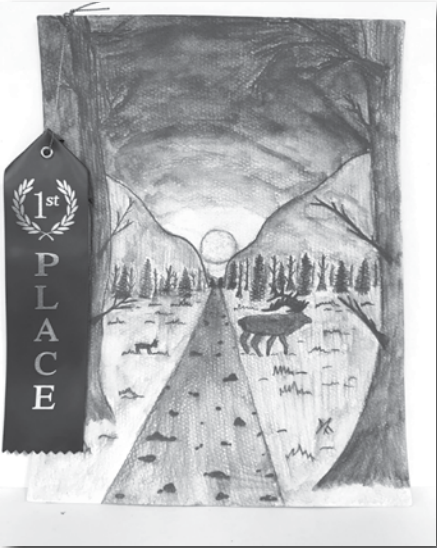
