Annual Prickly Pear Festival this weekend in Superior

As the long days of Summer linger into August, the annual festival of the resilient prickly pear cacti is hosted each year in downtown Superior, Arizona. This annual festival is often the beginning of the busy festival season in Superior and a kickoff to what will hopefully be only a few more weeks of intense summer heat! Rebuild Superior Inc. the event sponsor has a full day of fun for the entire family on Saturday, August 24!

Local businesses are all getting involved with this year's festival: Random Boutique will open for the next season with new inventory of clothing and home accessories; stop in for Prickly Pear Wine Spritzers at Bruzzi Vineyard wine boutique; and don't forget to try all the special menu items at many local restaurants including Bella's Cafe, Silver King Smokehouse and Porter's Saloon.

This year the event is scheduled to be a one-day event on

Saturday, Aug. 24, 2024.

The day kicks off early with harvesting of prickly pear fruit at the Superior Municipal Airport, located on US 60, 7-9 a.m. Participants are asked to bring their own bucket, tongs and gloves, and they are encouraged to wear long sleeve shirts, long pants and closed toe shoes. There will be a prize awarded for the largest prickly pear harvested.

After foraging for the delectable pink fruit, head over to Downtown Superior to the Superior Senior Center (187 Main Street) for a pancake breakfast benefitting the Superior Fire Department. There will be prickly pear syrup available. The breakfast will be hosted from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m.

The Farm to Fantastic Market will be hosting an expanded farmers market inside the Senior Center throughout the day.

Mural dedication for the new Love Where you Live mural will be at 10 a.m. at the corner of Keller and Main Street.

Retail vendors, food booths, entertainment and more will be held from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. This year, the guest speakers will be hosted at the Superior Chamber of Commerce, located at 165 Main Street.

There will be entertainment throughout the day and into the evening at Besich Park, including performances by Superior Dance Company.

The VFW post will be hosting a rummage sale to benefit the Superior Food Bank all day on Saturday.

A full listing of speakers was not available at press time. Some of the speakers being featured are renowned chef Bret Vibber who is considered a top chef in Arizona known for using foraged desert foods and the infamous Peter Bigfoot from the Revis Mountain School of Sustainability located in the remote Superstition Mountains. Check the schedule at the chamber of commerce to determine when specific speakers will be speaking.
